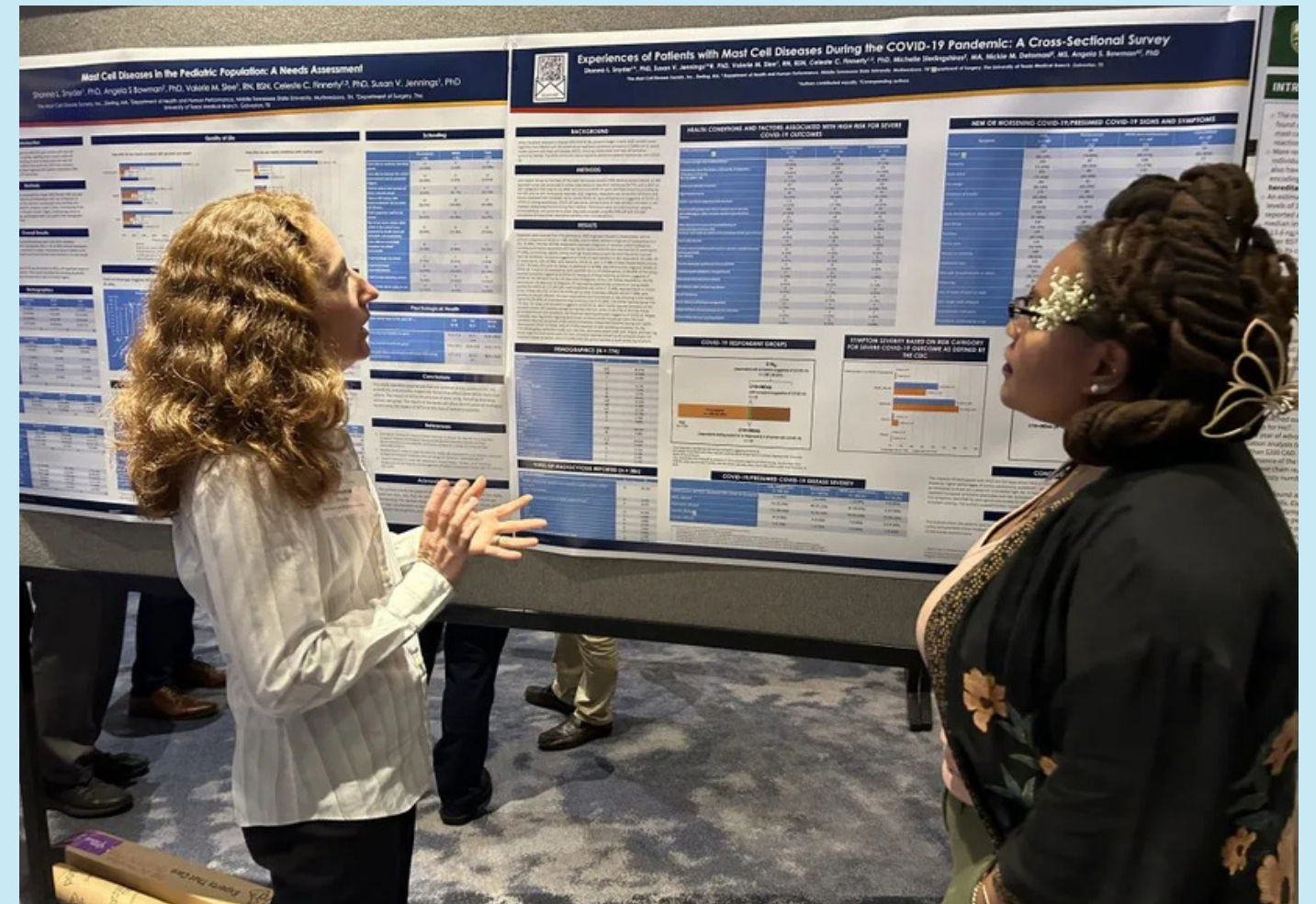
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TMS built global partnerships to strengthen mast cell research and collaboration.

Collaborating with dermatology professionals, we worked to better understand mast cell disorders in children.

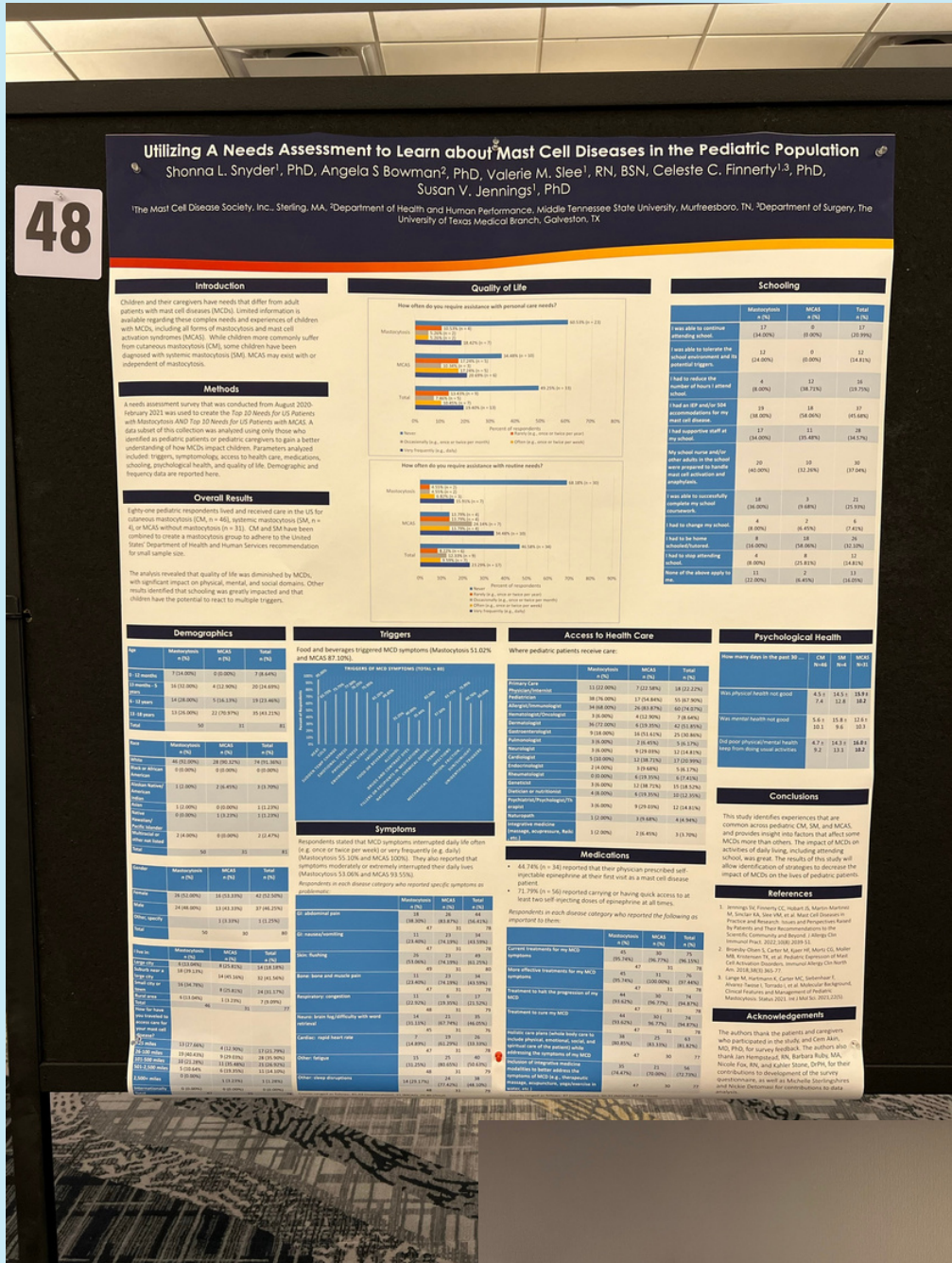


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Throughout 2024, TMS focused on bringing patients and caregivers together, creating spaces where knowledge meets compassion.

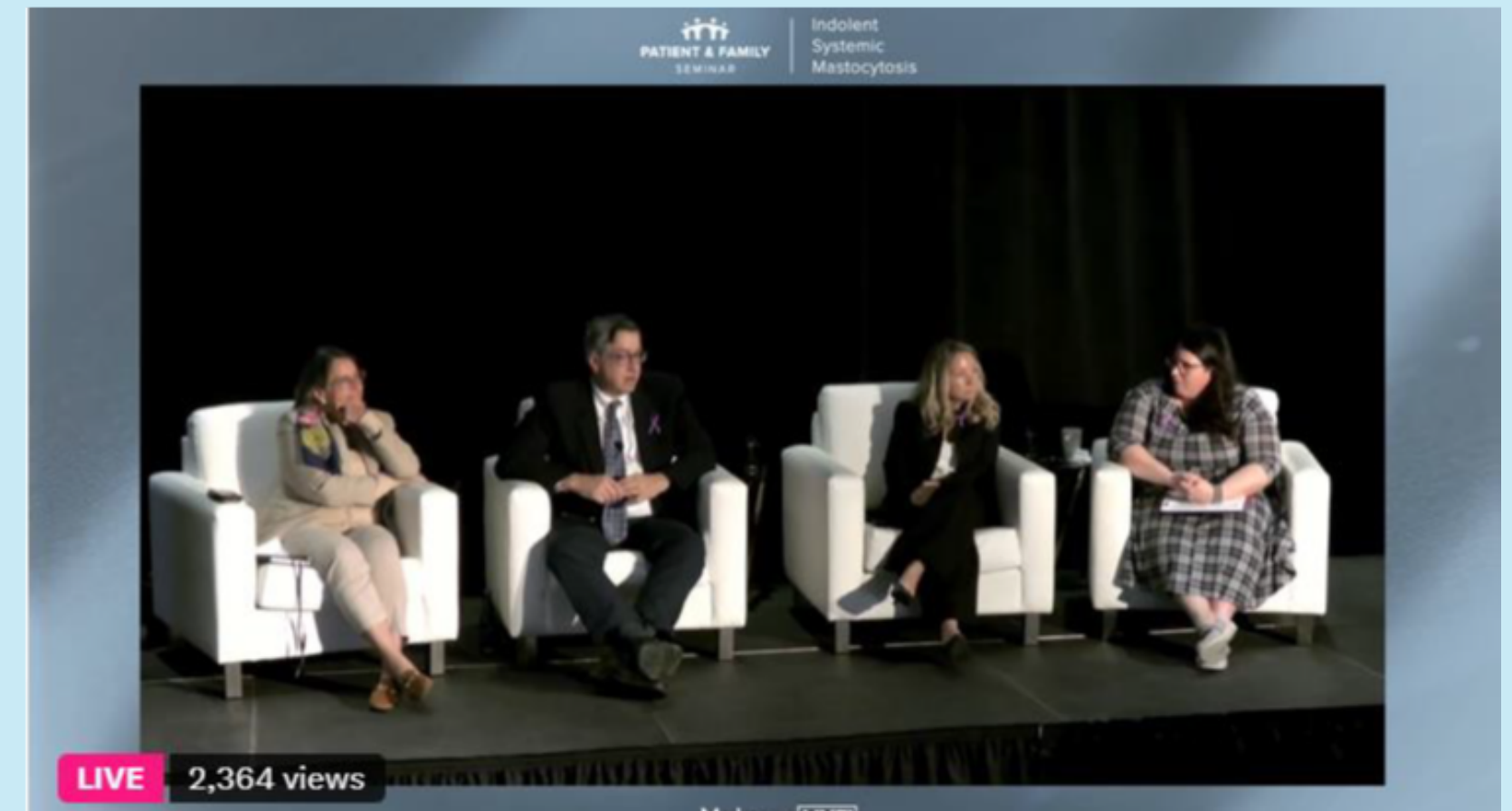

- **RESEARCH:** Generate funding and conduct research on causes and treatments for ISM and other mast cell diseases

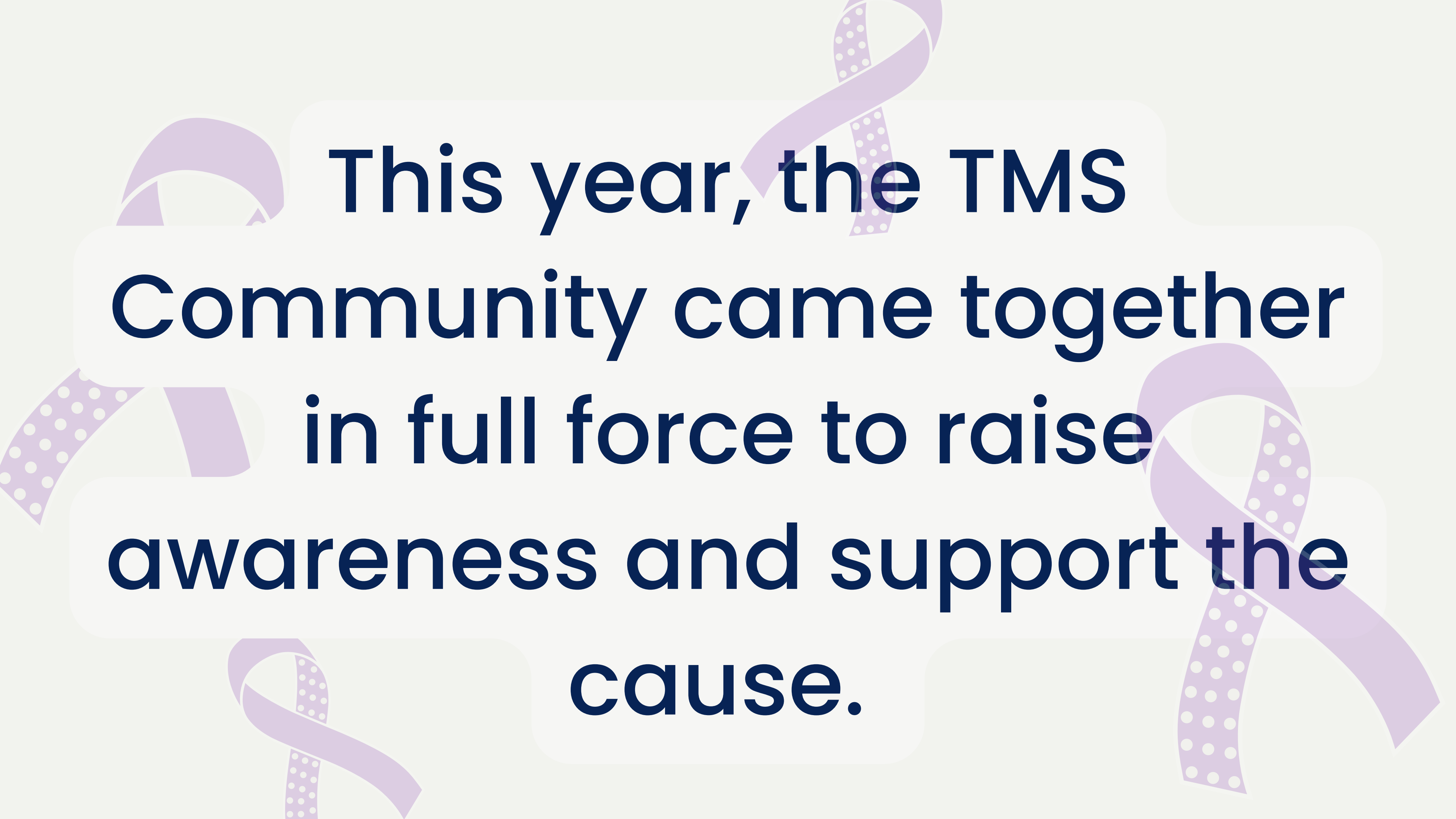
